

## **Community Bus**

The Port Colborne Community Bus has just completed its 5th week.

The Bus is co-ordinated by PORT CARES in partnership with The Province of Ontario, the City of Port Colborne and Laidlaw Transportation.

The fully Wheelchair accessible vehicle operates Mon to Fri, 8:00a.m. - 5:00p.m.

The service will operate as close to the schedule as possible, taking into account traffic and weather. The fare is \$2.00 per ride. Econo Passes are available: 20 rides for Adults are \$38.00, Seniors/Students \$36.00. Children under 12 riding with an adult ride for FREE.

Econo Passes can be obtained at PORT CARES, 92 Charlotte Street; and at Community Living, 100 McRae Street, both in Port Colborne.

Three separate routes cover all areas of the city with each route being covered four times throughout the day.

# In the best attended Mayors Breakfast on record, Porta Romana brings home the bacon

Sorry about the pun, couldn't resist. But with 56 guests for breakfast it was justified, as it was almost standing room only at this event as the pictures here show.



The food was, as would be expected, good, with a running buffet and free flowing coffee.

David Barrick chaired the event, and after calling the meeting to order introduced the mayors who spoke on matters provincial, regional and municipal, as follows:

# Mayor Harry, Wainfleet:

#### LIBRARY RENOVATIONS

Library construction commences March 20th. Thanks for the support of the Trillium Foundation. Utilizing internal staff to complete the renovations (Anthony Mallowany), work is expected to take from 4 to 6 weeks. Following construction work the Library will close for 2 weeks to paint and install carpeting, set and reshelf all material – books, DVD's etc.

The planned changes include:

- work areas and circulation desk for staff
- computer area with upgraded equipment
- reworked kitchen and meeting facilities
- Children's area with comfortable, age appropriate furnishings, to facilitate learning and a love of reading in the young
- Study and reading area with comfortable furniture (study tables and comfy chairs)

Marshville Heritage Society Lease Agreement March 14, 2006. Township entered into a ten year lease agreement with Marshville Heritage Society, effective from Jan. 1, 2006. The lease provides assurances for the long term development and upkeep of the Heritage Village, in accordance with the Heritage Society's five

# **Quarterly Mayors Breakfast**

Year Plan, and recognizes that the Heritage Village is a permanent and separate facility managed by the Heritage Society.

#### LAMBERT ROAD SECONDARY PLAN

The Township Planning Department has initiated the development of a secondary plan for the Lambert Road area, covering approx. 3800 acres of farm, rural & residential land.

The Secondary Plan will address development issues to determine if and how development should proceed, while protecting significant agricultural and natural heritage areas.

A steering committee of 6 area land owners and 2 councilors is being established with its first meeting proposed in April.

It is hoped that the Secondary Plan will be completed in the early fall of this year.

#### SEWER AND WATER

The Township expects to receive notification on the results of our COMRIF application in April.

#### RENOVATIONS FOR MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS

A new roof and entrance improvements have been completed at the Municipal Office.

Upgrades to the interior of the Council Chambers are complete and an open house/ dedication ceremony is planned to coincide with Canada Day Celebrations scheduled for July 1st.

Interior renovations to the Municipal Office are underway to improve staff workspace and provide a more friendly atmosphere for residents conducting municipal business activities.

#### BUDGET REVIEW

The tax levy is rising this year by 3.03%

Some projects in this years budget include Side Road #14, Garringer Road, Flanagan Road and Cement Road Reconstruction, the latter jointly with the City of Port Colborne

#### EASTER SEALS PROPERTY

Bidding tenders have closed and the property will soon be offered for sale on the market.

Council and I have made several attempts to try and preserve this land by placing it in public ownership, but to no avail.

Letters have been despatched on behalf of the Township to several government officials, including two Ministers, regretfully all replies to which indicated that they have no funds to contribute to the acquisition of the Easter Seals Lakewood Camp property.

A tentative meeting has been scheduled with the Chairman of Easter Seals Society and the Niagara Region, the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority, and the Township to discuss other options.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

4th Annual Wainfleet Mayor's Charity Golf Challenge: Wed. June 14, shotgun at 1 p.m. Proceeds benefit the Niagara Peninsula Children's Centre. The NPCC is an organization providing child and family-centred programs and services to children and adolescents requiring physiotherapy, occupational therapy, or speech-language pathology. Over 2,900 children each year from across Regional Niagara receive services from the Centre. There are currently 77 Wainfleet children

enrolled at the NPCC.
Those who are interested in participating are encouraged to contact the Township.

The Friendship Room opened March 1, 2006.

The room was designed to provide a permanent, exclusive facility to be used by the Wainfleet Senior's Drop-In Center.

We respect and admire the senior's contributions to our community. It is our sincerest hope that the Friendship Room will provide the Senior's Drop-in Center with the type of facility to promote creative and fellowship opportunities for their members.

As previously mentioned The Township of Wainfleet will be hosting a Canada Day Celebration scheduled to take place on Saturday, July 1st commencing at 1 p.m. A committee has been devised in organizing the event. In addition, an application will be submitted to the Department of Canadian Heritage, as they are awarding financial assistance to help support 'Celebrate Canada'. We hope to see you there!

# Mayor Bodner, Port:

#### Annual Niagara Week

The Niagara Region will be holding the Second Annual Niagara Week in Toronto on April 24 and 25. There will be discussion on the need to complete the 406 to East Main Street in Welland, and the request to rename Hwy. 140 to 406. I will be attending and meeting with the Ministers and government officials.

#### TOP HAT CEREMONY

Thanks to everyone that attended the Top Hat Ceremony of Tuesday. It was nice to see so many people turn out on such a cold morning. We honoured the tug and barge Petite Forte and St Marys Cement as the first downbound vessels.

#### NHS

I am pleased to see that the NHS has reopened the Constant Care Unit in our hospital. I have been in close communications with the NHS on this and they had early on reassured me of its reopening. I attended a job fair that the NHS held to recruit nurses to the Niagara Region and it was met with great success.

#### BUDGET

Council is in the middle of setting the 2006 Municipal Budget. So far residents face a preliminary increase of 4.74 per cent in the city's portion of the property tax bill. The next budget meeting is Thurs, March 30 at 6:30 p.m.

#### COMMUNITY BUS

The Port Colborne Community Bus has become a reality. This is exciting news for the City of Port Colborne. This venture has been made possible by money from the Province through the Gas Tax, and a grant from Port Colborne Hydro Inc. Port Cares is the coordinator of this project and they need to be commended for making it all come together. Last week 75 people travelled on the bus. There is an opportunity to have your business name or logo on the side of this bus for a fee. This will help offset the cost of this service

#### PROVINCIAL BUDGET

Finance Minister Dwight Duncan is bringing down a budget today. There will be money for transit as well as money for roads, etc.

I will be raising this during budget deliberations as I believe it vitally important to the future of our city. This plan is important not just to keep us focused on where we believe our community should be down the road, but to provide those interested in investing in our city with a clear understanding of what to expect in the future.

If accepted by council I believe that the South Niagara Community Futures Development Corporation would be the best choice to coordinate this plan. By tapping into their expertise and by partnering with different levels of government we will be able to leverage two for one dollars to complete this plan. The city portion will be \$5,000 or less.

This plan is about more than economics or economic development. It builds on a vision for the community in a wide range of areas.
